SCHOOL NEWS 2022 KINDERGARTEN ENROLMENTS

The School is currently taking enrolments for Kindergarten in 2022. If you are a parent, or know of a parent with a child that was born between **July 1 2017 and June 30 2018** they are eligible to attend Kindergarten in 2022.

Please enrol your child by coming into our school office.

You must provide ORIGINALS of the following documents:

- •Birth Certificate
- •Passport and Visa Information if applicable
- •Immunisation Certificate must be no more than 2 months old.
- •Medical records where applicable (e.g. asthma, allergies, disability)
- •Family Court Orders
- •Proof of residence e.g. lease agreement, a current Synergy, Alinta, Telstra account showing your name and residential address.

If your child is not born in Australia, you must provide:

- •Evidence of the date of entry into Australia
- •Passport Number
- •Visa Grant Number (This is the unique number assigned to the visa and shown on the letter that notified you of your visa grant)
- •Passport or travel documents
- •Current visa and previous visas (if applicable)

SCHOOL NEWS SCIENCE

The students have conducted many investigations using a wide range of scientific resources this semester. They have applied their inquiry skills and scientific knowledge to better uderstand everyday observations. This term, the Year Four classes have investigated forces such as friction, magnetism and gravity. The Year Six classes have measured the voltage of small solar panels, motors and made voltic piles and lemon batteries! The Year One students have explored high and low pitch sounds and sources of light.

Our students have used modern and innovative resources, including digital technologies to complete their science investigations. They regularly ask and respond to questions and uncover or discover the answers by doing 'hands on' experiments. Overall, our students' have enjoyed learning new skills and developing their scientific understandings, including the importance of science in their lives and today's society.
