Hello All,

What a full term it has been!



As we head into the Easter break and holidays, take a moment to breathe and reflect on all the positive moments you have experienced. Then try to find a little time to refresh yourself even if you're still working, as it's important for your own wellbeing.

Here are a few simple ways to find some quality time with your children without spending a cent.

Have your child read to you – When you are feeling worn out, and they are still buzzing, ask your child to read you a story. This gives them an opportunity to talk and feel heard, while you rest and enjoy a snuggle.

Talk to your children or play games in the car while traveling from one place to another. Spotto – Red cars and buses, or orange cars, and trains is always a favourite in our car, and let them choose what the Spotto is, it could be birds or planes, the list is endless.

Watch a short video or podcast with your child about a topic they could be interested in like science, wildlife, or history. The fun of sitting around a phone or iPad will also encourage conversations that you can build on to include your worldviews and values.

Include Your kids in day-to-day household jobs If you need to pop to Bunnings for some fertiliser, or you may need some piping for a new drainpipe. Grab your child and use these menial tasks as teachable moments, get them to rake up the autumn leaves with you and talk about the seasons and what you like about each one. This is also an opportunity to have some one-on-one time as you drive to Bunnings or work in the garden together. Kids want your time more than they want a special activity.

Practice gentle Discipline- try and turn behaviour issues into opportunities for teachable moments about life and relationships and valuing each other. Try to take a step back, breathe and invest in your precious ones, that is quality parenting.

School News

School and Office Hours

The school office is open from o8:30am to 3:30pm.

Classroom doors open at o8:40am and the bell to start the school day is at o8:50am. Children must not arrive before 8:30am unless they are doing a leadership role or Thursday Fit Club.

Parents can use the services of Camp Australia to arrange before and after school care to accommodate for working hours.

Medical Needs for Students

It is very important that families inform the school of any medical needs for students. This includes asthma, allergies, anaphylaxis and any other conditions that may affect the wellbeing and safety of a student during the school day. If your child has a current medical condition or develops one throughout the school year, please obtain the medical forms from the front office and return them with updated medication and a current ASCIA Action Plan from your doctor as required.

Mobile Phones Policy

Between the hours of 8:30am-3:05pm mobile phones will not be used by students for any communication purposes. Smart watches must be placed into 'aeroplane mode' and mobile phones are to be handed in to the office, for safe keeping, when students arrive at school and collected at the end of the day.

Absentees

If your child is absent from school, please contact the school office on 6216 4400 or email bullcreek.ps@education.wa.edu.au as early as possible to advise of the reason for absence.

Late Arrival / Early Departures

Students arriving at school after 9am must be signed in at the office by a parent or guardian before entering their classroom.

Students leaving school early, must be signed out at the office before the student is collected from class.

RAT Tests

The school still has a large supply of both oral and nasal RAT tests. Please come to the office and collect any amount you wish.

Parking

Some of the parking in front of the school is a pick up and drop off zone only (Kiss and Drive). For the safety of all of our children, please do not park and/or exit your vehicle in the marked out green parking area on Francisco Crescent. If you are early, please continue to move around the block in a clockwise direction until your child is ready at the Kiss and Drive collection point.

It is illegal and dangerous to double park anywhere along the school boundary roads.

When collecting from the classroom, please find a safe parking space around the school. Parking is also available on Darley Circle with laneway access onto the school grounds.

Parking is not permitted in the staff car parks at all times and for safety reasons, please do not walk through the staff car parks before, during or after school.




